

DONOVAN SCHOOL DRAFT ENROLMENT SCHEME

Home zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and *shown on the attached map*) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Includes both sides of the road, and all roads and streets within the area described below:

- Starting at the intersection of Bay Road and North Road (Winton-Lorneville Highway), west along Bay Road.
- Along Ferry Road to the coast, including properties between Bay Road and the Waihopai River on Drury Lane, Moray Crescent, and Nevis Crescent, as well as Alison Road and Waimatuku Bush Road to #940.
- The intersection of Taramoa-West Plains Road and West Plains Road. East along West Plains Road, to Steel Road, including Moffett Road, Leonard Road and Wills Road.
- Steel Road to the intersection with Crowe Road. From the intersection of Steel Road and Moore Road, east to North Road (Winton-Lorneville Highway).
- North Road from the intersection of Beaconsfield Rd to McIvor Rd.
- From the intersection of North Road (Winton-Lorneville Highway) and McIvor Road, east along McIvor Road, up to but not including Retreat Road.
- From the North Road (Winton-Lorneville Highway) and McIvor Road intersection, south to the intersection with Bainfield Road, including all roads running between North Road and Donovan Park.
- East along Bainfield Road to the intersection with Queens Drive, including Glenroy Park Drive.
- South along Queens Drive to the Waihopai River.
- West following the Waihopai River to the start at the intersection of Bay Road and North Road (Winton-Lorneville Highway).

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required. (This sentence is not compulsory.)

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone. (This paragraph is not compulsory.)



Out of zone enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- First Priority: This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.*
- Second priority must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- Third priority must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- Fourth priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- Fifth priority must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- · Sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
