
PTA RAFFLE

Stationery for 2026

In this newsletter we have included the stationery lists for 2026. Apart from a new entrant, all other students will need to purchase their stationery independently of the school. We have two main providers that have our list and you can order online at a special rate, www.myschool.co.nz (Officemax) and <https://schoolpacks.co.nz> (Qizzle) Your orders can be delivered direct to home. Both companies offer a back to school price, so very competitive.

Lost Property

Please keep checking the lost property. It will be on display every Friday outside the hall. Any items left will be donated to charity at the end of each term. If you can't make a Friday then please come and check the lost property box in the hall foyer at any time.



Absences

Please remember to contact the office via School Stream, phone, text or email to advise of any students absence or lateness. The Ministry of Education is still encouraging schools to follow up more vigorously for non attendance. If we have no contact we will mark your child as Truant. Holidays during term time are not accepted and your child will be marked with an unjustified absence.

Remember to keep an eye on School Stream as we have a lot going on this term, and School Stream is how we will keep you informed.

We have communicated many times about the major priority of the Government around attendance and being at school on time. This year NZ schools are implementing new procedures, these are to be in place by Term 1 2026. The Government target is for 80% of students to attend regularly, that is to attend school more than 90% of the time.

Good Attendance (Good chance of success)—is less than 5 days absence in a school term.

Worrying Attendance (Less chance of success) is up to 10 days absence in a school term.

Concerning Attendance (Hard to make progress) is up to 15 days absence in a school term.

Serious Concern (Very hard to make progress) is 15 days or more of absence in a school term.

We will communicate with you if your child is at any of the above stages and we will endeavour to work with you to achieve good attendance.

Lateness is electronically recorded and monitored. Of all absence problems, this is by far our biggest concern.

Having learners at school, in class by 8.50am is what we need to achieve., A reminder—children are NOT to be dropped off before 8.20am. There is no supervision of care until 8.20am.

Please remember the canteen do not make up noodles. If you wish your child to have noodles please make them up and put them into a flask or suitable container that will keep them hot.

Also be careful of the plastic containers that food is coming in as some of the cheap containers melt in the pie-warmers.

Sistema containers seem to be the best with either the vent on top or click clack type fastenings. If the food is suitable, tinfoil works well.
